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Hearing of the New Jersey State Health Care Administration Board was taken via Teams videoconference before Michelle M. Downes, a Certified Court Reporter of the State of New Jersey, commencing at 9:17 a.m. on the above date, there being present:

MS. ROBERTS: Good morning, everyone. Lissette, I know you keep us in line. If you can call us to order and read the notice.

MS. SANTIAGO-RIVERA: Sure. This is the formal meeting of the Health Care Administration Board. Adequate notice of this meeting has been published in accordance with the provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, including but not limited to NJSA 10:4-9.1, 10:4-9.3, and 10:4-10. Notice was sent to the Secretary of State who posted the notice in a public place. Notice was also provided electronically on the department's website and forwarded to two New Jersey newspapers.

I will now call the role. Ms. Jenkins?
MS. JENKINS: Here.
MS. SANTIAGO-RIVERA: Mr. Paulino?
MR. PAULINO: Here.
MS. SANTIAGO-RIVERA: Mr. Havens?
MR. HAVENS: Here.
MS. SANTIAGO-RIVERA: Ms. Roberts?
MS. ROBERTS: Here.
MS. SANTIAGO-RIVERA: And Mr. Baker is not present today. Okay.

MS. ROBERTS: So we do still have a
quorum?
MS. SANTIAGO-RIVERA: Yes, we do. We have four members of the board present which does constitute a quorum.

MS. ROBERTS: Excellent. So the first item of business here is the approval of the minutes of February 15, 2024. Did anyone have any corrections or comments? okay, hearing none.

MS. JENKINS: Is that for the transcript, too? I'm sorry. Are we approving the transcript? Is that and the minutes or is that -I'm sorry.

MS. ROBERTS: I think we only have to approve the minutes, but does anyone have any corrections or comments on either?

MS. JENKINS: I did. I just had one quick one on the transcript just to note for page 49 1ine 23 to 24 , it notes Lissette Santiago-Rivera as the speaker, but it was really Laurie Facciarossa Brewer. She's the state's ombudsman. So I just wanted to make that one small correction.

MS. ROBERTS: Okay. Thank you for that. Can someone make a motion to approve the minutes of February 15th?

MR. HAVENS: This is Ellsworth. I move
the minutes.

MS. ROBERTS: Thank you. So the next item of business is the commissioner's report.

MS. JENKINS: Hi everyone. okay. I just have a quick update. You probably heard in the news that there's been several cases of measles popping up in several states in the United States. New Jersey has confirmed one case of measles this year. And the department is collaborating with local health departments to investigate eight suspected cases of mumps. It's a family cluster up in

Hunterdon County that's related to international travel.

These are cases of vaccine-preventable diseases that are spreading across the country. So the department's urging individuals, especially parents and caregivers, to be aware of symptoms, because these are high1y contagious viruses.

So measles, you know, you can have -symptoms can appear one to two weeks after exposure. It can be high fever, you know, cough, runny nose, and then the rash starts three to five days after symptoms.

Mumps usually starts with a fever, headache, muscle aches, tiredness, loss of appetite, and that's when you start to see then the swelling of, you know, classic you would see of your salivary glands and the puffy cheeks. So this is just a reminder to encourage everyone to stay up-to-date with your measles, mumps and rubella shots.

And for rules that are coming down, we still are working on $8: 43 \mathrm{H}$ and we hope -- those are for rehabilitation hospitals, and we hope to have them done very soon. So that's all I have.

MS. ROBERTS: Excellent. Thank you, Ms. Jenkins.

So with that, I believe we'11 call Mr. Barnhart for the next item on the agenda. MR. BARNHART: Good morning. I am Patrick Barnhart. I'm a regulatory officer in the Certificate of Need and Licensing Division. I'm joining to present a notice of readoption with technical changes for New Jersey Administrative Code 8:30, Rules Implementing the Health Care Professional Responsibility and Reporting Enhancement Act. Under these rules, licensed health care facilities may inquire into the past conduct of health care professionals from prior employers.

The chapter also provides notice of reporting requirements for misconduct and establishes fines for the failure to report or respond to an inquiry. The chapter is scheduled to expire on May 15, 2024.

There is one technical change to the chapter which corrects a cross reference in subchapter six related to penalties. Does anyone have any questions?

MS. ROBERTS: okay. If there are no questions from the board members, I'd like to open this up to the public. Is there anyone from the public who would like to be heard on this matter?

Lissette, were we aware of anyone on the line that wanted to speak?

MS. SANTIAGO-RIVERA: No, I received no messages.

MS. ROBERTS: We11, then I believe we wi11 entertain a motion.

MS. JENKINS: Ellsworth, are you going to?
